#### Healing with Alateen

What a difference Alateen would have made in my childhood! I could have forgiven my father's absence from my life, realizing that his primary relationship was with alcohol. I would have understood my mother's bitterness and hatred of him after their divorce. I would have been less hurt when she blurted out, "You're just like your father," when I was a preteen. I would have had compassion for my rageaholicalcoholic stepfather, realizing that he was an adult child of an alcoholic who was also damaged by the Pacific campaign in the Second World War—untreated PTSD in my face.

Becoming an Alateen sponsor in my early 40's was a significant accelerant of my Al-Anon recovery. A young woman in Berkeley, California, once said to me, "I'm being an Alateen sponsor for myself," and I knew exactly what she meant. Carrying the message to young people who were dealing with situations even more dramatic than the one I endured was fulfilling and increased my self-esteem. When I witnessed kids in the groups I co-sponsored in the East Bay using the knowledge and coping skills they learned in Alateen, I felt a profound sense of joy. Those Alateens knew they had options and tools that could sustain them through the years when they had no way to physically escape their troubled families.

Consistent Al-Anon service has been a huge part of my recovery; however, I'm proudest of my years involved with Alateen. I became the Alternate Alateen Coordinator for Northern California and then the co-sponsor of one of the huge Northern California Alateen Conventions. A few years after moving



#### My Unofficial Alateen Sponsor

When I was 11 years in Al-Anon in Northern California I was blessed to be in a home group that sponsored a monthly Alateen panel. The teens leading those meetings would briefly share their stories and choose a topic for the members to share on. The leaders consisted of two to four Alateen members between the ages of 15 to 18.

Before Alateen, these kids truly had few options for living with alcoholism. They couldn't go and live with another family down the street when things spun out of control in their homes. They didn't have their own money and didn't have transportation except for possibly bicycles or skateboards.

At the end of each panel meeting, I often made a beeline to talk to one of the "regulars" on the panel that attended every month, a young man of 16. He introduced me to the Alateen literature and suggested I do a Fourth Step inventory in the Alateen booklet. Given my history of growing up with alcoholism, that ended up being the best advice for me at the time. I gained far greater benefit from the Alateen literature than I did from the Al-Anon literature with an adult child focus. This young man never knew it, but he was my unofficial Alateen sponsor.

Keeping group information up-to-date is vital to assuring that the most accurate meeting information is provided to persons seeking help in the Al-Anon and Alateen fellowship.

When submitting meeting updates for any of the above, be sure to include:

- The official name of your group
- Your meeting's ID number (see below)
- The description of changes (for GR or CMA, please include the person's name, home address, and email address)

#### HOW TO FIND YOUR MEETING ID



The WSO (World Service Office) assigns every meeting an ID number that groups will need in order to make changes to group records. To find out your meeting's ID online:

- 1. Go to the WSO's "Find an Al-Anon Meeting" webpage: www.al-anon.org/al-anon-meetings/find-an-al-anon-meeting
- 2. Enter the meeting's address (or ZIP Code or City) in the "Enter an Address" field. As you type the address, a list of nearby meetings will be displayed and can be refined.
- 3. Scroll through the search results in the left panel to find the meeting information, narrowing the search if necessary. The official name of a group is displayed at the top of the meeting details. The WSO ID number is displayed near the end of the meeting information as the "Group ID."



#### I Always Feel Better

I have been in Alateen regularly for eight years. My dad is in A.A. and my mom is in Al Anon. Even though we don't have active alcoholism in our home, my family thinks it's important for all of us to be in recovery. I think we have a pretty positive family.

I have learned how to be a service-oriented person from my parents and my Alateen groups. At my Alateen meetings, I like to set up the room and get the books. We rotate being the Chairperson and picking the topic.

Some of the kids in my Alateen group live in homes like mine where nobody drinks. Some of the kids have parents who are still having troubles. At our meetings, we read from our literature and talk about ways to feel better about ourselves and our lives. We tell new members that alcoholism is a family disease, and that they didn't cause it, they can't control it, and they can't cure it.

During our meetings, we focus on a topic, like feelings, slogans, the Steps, Traditions, or a sharing from our Alateen literature. Then we share what we are doing well and what we need to work on. Next, we share our "Happies and Crappies," and we end with our "Gratitudes." Our meetings go quickly, and we have fun. Parents might think we are talking about them, but we really focus on ourselves and our own problems. I notice that I always feel better after I go to a meeting.

"I Don't Keep Score Anymore" is the title of a sharing in Intimacy in Alcoholic Relationships. It was also a topic at my weekly meeting, but a completely new take on this statement has since popped into my mind. I could stop keeping score: I did this, you did that, and now you owe me because I did more than you. But what I discovered was that I could keep a whole different scoreboard. I had been counting the negative things and feeling self-pity and righteousness. What about counting all the ways love has been shown to me? What about focusing on the abundance in my life instead of the supposed lack? I saw in a different light how I had tried to cheer myself up earlier in the day, but it hadn't quite worked. I had been cleaning and dusting stuff on shelves in my home. My intention was to look at each thing as I cleaned and dusted it, remembering the gift and the positive memory it brought to mind. It all finally sunk in when I went to my meeting and read the words, "I don't keep score any more."


